To Colville High School Students and Parents:

We are beyond excited about the prospect of having students back in the building starting Tuesday, October 13, 2020. In order for our schools to stay open, we will need to follow guidelines which include social distancing, wearing masks, and washing hands. The following are highlights of what is expected of students as they return to Colville High School.

1. To enter the building every person must wear a face mask that covers their mouth and nose and one that is school appropriate – bandanas and gaiters do not meet Center for Disease Control requirements.
2. All students should bring a Daily Symptom Check card signed by their parent (these cards will be provided by the school) and as students enter the building a staff member will take their temperature and write it on the card and file the card. A new card needs to be brought to school each day. These cards will stay on file for 30 days then be shredded. We are enclosing one card today for the first day of school and will send a pack home with your student for the rest of the month. If a student does not bring a card they will need to complete a daily health screening with a staff member, which includes answering symptom questions and having a temperature taken.
3. All students need to check out a chrome book (if they have not previously done so) and take it to each class every day. If you bring your own device you will not be able to sign on to the CSD Wifi, but you will be able to sign on as a guest. However, you may not have all the access you need or the ability to print. We have enough chrome books for all students.
4. All drinking fountains are turned off except the bottle filler to reduce touch points. Please bring a water bottle from home. We have purchased bottled water available for student use.
5. Students will not be able to use their lockers. Students will need to carry their backpacks, books and personal items to each classroom. If you do not have a backpack we will have extras available.
6. Included in this letter is a copy of our daily bell schedule. We will have two breaks and two lunches to reduce the number of students in the cafeteria at one time. Students will need to social distance during break and lunch, with only two students at a table at one time. Also, as you know, students will attend in a hybrid model with Option A Monday/Wednesday and every other Friday or Option B Tuesday/Thursday and every other Friday. Your student's class schedule and their days to attend school is enclosed.

There will be a district calendar of the hybrid days on the district and high school websites.

7. School doors will open at 7:35 AM and students will need to leave the campus by 3:00 PM.

8. To alleviate hallway congestion we are asking students to walk in one direction in the halls. They will be asked to walk in front of the main office towards the east end of the building and then use the other academic hall to walk the other direction. We will have directional signs.

9. Remote students will receive an individual phone call to develop a plan for remote learning.

10. Freshman Orientation Tours will occur between 10:00 am to 2:00 pm and 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm on Monday, October 12. Students may show up at any time during these hours to get a tour of the school.

11. Mask Breaks -- If a student needs a mask break they may ask their teacher to step out of the educational setting for a brief period of time.

12. Student Meals -- The state is allowing schools to provide student meals free of charge until the end of this school year. If you have qualified for free and reduced meals in the past, it is still essential to apply again this year as this provides for other school funding sources.

13. Due to the required health check-ins we will have **closed campus for lunch for all grades.**
